APPELLATE PROCEDURE - FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT

WHEREAS, a circuit-wide policy does not exist for the manner in which appeals from county to circuit court are accomplished and;

WHEREAS, the issue has been thoroughly studied and various recommendations presented to the Court, it is

ORDERED that:

1. The appellate panels for Escambia and Santa Rosa counties shall consist of three judges each.
2. The appellate panels for Okaloosa and Walton counties shall consist of one judge each.
3. The administrative judges of each county shall prepare such administrative directives as may be necessary to give effect to this order.
