(Vacates OCAD2023-07 & OCAD2006-07)**

**IN RE:       CIRCUIT AND COUNTY COURT DIVISION ASSIGNMENTS FOR  
              OKALOOSA, COUNTY, FLORIDA**

**WHEREAS**, the following will set forth the delivery and caseloads assigned to each Division. Therefore,  
it is,

**ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:**

1.     EFFECTIVE DATE: The administrative policies and procedures herein, shall be effective September 5, 2023.
2.     DELIVERY OF ARREST REPORTS TO CLERK: All arrest reports shall be delivered to the Clerk of the Court for Okaloosa County, Florida, no later than **three (3) working days** following the arrest.
3.     DELIVERY OF BONDS TO CLERK: All bonds shall be delivered to the Clerk of Court, for Okaloosa County, Florida, no later than **three (3) working days** after being accepted by law enforcement.
4.     ARRAIGNMENT AND TRIAL DATES FOR COUNTY COURT:
  - a.     Any Misdemeanor Arraignment shall be set for the next following Arraignment Day which is at least **fifteen (15) calendar days** after each misdemeanor arrest;
  - b.     All misdemeanor bonds shall be made returnable for the next following Arraignment Day which is at least **fifteen (15) calendar days** from the date of arrest; and
  - c.     Each Violation of Probation, in County Court, shall be set for the next following Arraignment Day which is at least **fifteen (15) calendar days** after each violation of county probation arrest.

All Misdemeanor Arraignments shall be scheduled as set forth below:

NORTH OKALOOSA COUNTY MISDEMEANOR ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Misdemeanor Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse, located in Crestview, Florida, at 9:30 a.m. (CST) and all Arraignment Days are scheduled on designated Tuesdays as set forth in the current annual Okaloosa County Courts Schedule.

SOUTH OKALOOSA COUNTY MISDEMEANOR ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Misdemeanor Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse Annex Extension, located in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, at 1:30 p.m. (CST) and all Arraignment Days are scheduled on every Tuesday as set forth in the current annual Okaloosa County Courts Schedule. All Traffic related issues, including but not limited to mandatory civil traffic infractions, shall be conducted at 9:00 a.m. (CST).

Any Misdemeanor Arraignment Day which falls on a legal holiday that is observed by the Court shall be held as directed by the presiding Judge. All Misdemeanor Trial Dates shall be set by the presiding Judge at that arraignment. All County Court Evidentiary Hearings regarding Violations of Probation, shall be set by the presiding Judge at that Arraignment.

5. CASE DISTRIBUTION OF VIOLATION OF PROBATION/COMMUNITY CONTROL & CO-DEFENDANT CASES FOR COUNTY COURT: All violation of probation and/or community control cases involving a new substantive offense shall be transferred to the Division to which the newest substantive case is assigned, as set forth and provided in herein. Any violations of probation and/community control shall follow the newest substantive case assignment as set forth herein. The Clerk of the Court for Okaloosa County, Florida, shall transfer any case with any new substantive offense to the Division in which the newest substantive case is assigned. Upon receipt of a memorandum from the Office of the State Attorney to the Clerk of the Court advising the Clerk of any new substantive case, that case shall be transferred to the Division in which the oldest open substantive case is assigned, without the necessity of an Order from the Court.

In all cases involving co-defendants, those cases shall be assigned to the Division to which the oldest open substantive case is assigned.

In any criminal cases involving multiple charges against the same defendant, those cases shall be disposed of in the Division in which the oldest open substantive case is originally assigned unless, upon agreement and stipulation of counsel, the cases are transferred in the interest of judicial economy. Criminal cases assigned to a Division at either the Okaloosa County Courthouse, located in Crestview, Florida, or Okaloosa County Courthouse Annex Extension, located in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, as defined in herein, shall be disposed of in the Division to which the oldest open substantive case is assigned, upon agreement and stipulation by the Office of the State Attorney and the defendant prior to any transfer.

6. ARRAIGNMENT AND TRIAL DATES FOR CIRCUIT COURT:

- a. Any Felony Arraignment shall be set for the next following Arraignment Day which is at least **thirty (30) calendar days** after each Felony arrest, to include cases where information has not been filed;
- b. All Felony bonds shall be made returnable for the next following Arraignment Day which is at least **thirty (30) calendar days** from the date of arrest; and
- c. Each Violation of Probation and each Violation of Community Control, in Circuit Court, shall be set for arraignment in the assigned division for the next following Miscellaneous date or Violation of Probation Date which is at least **ten (10) calendar days** from the date of arrest.

All Felony Arraignments shall be scheduled as set forth below:

NORTH OKALOOSA COUNTY FELONY ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Felony Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse, located in Crestview, Florida, at 1:30 p.m. (CST) and all Arraignments Days are scheduled on the first Thursday after the first Monday of each Month and the fourth Thursday after the first Monday of each Month.

SOUTH OKALOOSA COUNTY FELONY ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Felony Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse Annex Extension, located in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, at 1:30 p.m. (CST). Any Arraignment Days for cases assigned to **Division 1 (Cases A-K)** shall be scheduled on the second Thursday after the first Monday of each Month and the third Tuesday after the first Monday of each Month. Any Arraignment Days for cases assigned to **Division 2 (Cases L-Z)** shall be scheduled on the second Thursday after the first Monday of each Month and the third Thursday after the first Monday of each Month.

Any Felony Arraignment Day which falls on a legal holiday that is observed by the Court shall be held as directed by the presiding Judge. All Felony Trial dates shall be set in the assigned division for the next trial cycle which is at least **sixty (60) calendar days** after the date of Felony

arrest, to include cases where information has not been filed. For purposes of this Administrative Directive the first day of the trial cycle is Docket Day. No case, to include cases where information has not been filed, shall be removed from the trial cycle in the assigned Division without the consent of the presiding Judge in that Division. All Circuit Court Evidentiary Hearings for Violations of Probation and Violation of Community Control, in Circuit Court, shall be set by the presiding Judge at that Arraignment.

7. CASE DISTRIBUTION OF VIOLATION OF PROBATION/COMMUNITY CONTROL & CO-DEFENDANT CASES FOR CIRCUIT COURT: All violation of probation and/or community control cases involving a new substantive offense shall be transferred to the Division to which the newest substantive case is assigned, as set forth and provided in herein. Any violations of probation and/community control shall follow the newest substantive case assignment as set forth herein. The Clerk of the Court for Okaloosa County, Florida, shall transfer any case with any new substantive offense to the Division in which the newest substantive case is assigned. Upon receipt of a memorandum from the Office of the State Attorney to the Clerk of the Court advising the Clerk of any new substantive case, that case shall be transferred to the Division in which the oldest open substantive case is assigned, without the necessity of an Order from the Court.

In all cases involving co-defendants, those cases shall be assigned to the Division to which the oldest open substantive case is assigned.

In any criminal cases involving multiple charges against the same defendant, those cases shall be disposed of in the Division in which the oldest open substantive case is originally assigned unless, upon agreement and stipulation of counsel, the cases are transferred in the interest of judicial economy. Criminal cases assigned to a Division at either the Okaloosa County Courthouse, located in Crestview, Florida, or Okaloosa County Courthouse Annex Extension, located in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, as defined in herein, shall be disposed of in the Division to which the oldest open substantive case is assigned, upon agreement and stipulation by the Office of the State Attorney and the defendant prior to any transfer.

8. ARRAIGNMENT AND AJUDICATORY DATES FOR JUVENILE COURT:
- a. All Juvenile Arraignments shall be set for the next following Arraignment Day, in the assigned division, which occurs **twenty-eight (28) calendar days** after each juvenile arrest; and
  - b. Each Violation of Probation in Juvenile Court shall be set for arraignment in the assigned division the next following Juvenile Court Date which is no less than **three (3) working days** from the date of arrest, unless otherwise directed by the presiding Judge.

All Juvenile Arraignments shall be scheduled as set forth below:

NORTH OKALOOSA JUVENILE ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Juvenile Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse located in Crestview, Florida, at 9:00 a.m. (CST) and all Arraignment Days are scheduled the first Thursday after the first Monday of each Month and the third Thursday after the first Monday of each Month.

SOUTH OKALOOSA JUVENILE ARRAIGNMENT DAYS: All Juvenile Arraignment days shall be conducted at the Okaloosa County Courthouse Annex Extension located in Fort Walton Beach, Florida, at 9:00 a.m. (CST) and all Arraignment Days are scheduled for the first Wednesday after the first Monday of each Month and the third Wednesday after the first Monday of each Month.

Any Juvenile Arraignment Day which falls on a legal holiday that is observed by the Court shall be held as directed by the presiding Judge. All Adjudicatory hearings, set in Juvenile Court shall be set by the presiding Judge at that Arraignment. All Adjudicatory Hearings for Violations of Probation, set in Juvenile Court, shall be set by the presiding Judge at that Arraignment.

11. GENERAL MAGISTRATE: All of the following matters in Okaloosa County, Florida, shall be handled by the General Magistrate:
  - a. Baker Act and Marchman Act Hearings;
  - b. Pro Se Family Law;
  - c. Family Law Post Judgment;
  - d. Dependency Drug Court;
  - e. Dependency Truancy Court ;
  - f. Recusals from Child Support Hearing Officer; and
  - g. Any other matters specifically referred.
12. CHILD SUPPORT HEARING OFFICER: All cases, related to Title IV-D (Department of Revenue) child support issues, in Okaloosa, County, Florida, shall be heard by the Child Support Hearing Officer.
13. SPECIALTY & OTHER COURTS ASSIGNED TO JUDGES: All specialty and other Court duties are assigned to individual Judges in Okaloosa County, Florida. All specialty and other Court duties are distributed to stakeholders via a memorandum, and these policies and procedure shall be effective as of the date of this Administrative Directive.

DUTY JUDGE: Duty Judge assignments and responsibilities are set forth and provided in Administrative Directive OCAD 2021-07. *See* OCAD 2021-07.

SHELTER & DETENTIONS: Any Judge assigned to handle Family Law Cases, shall handle all Shelters & Detentions on a rotation schedule commencing at 1:00 pm (CST). Shall a replacement be required the Judge seeking such replacement is responsible for securing that replacement.
